### **1. DESCRIPTION OF WORK**

- 1.1. This tender enquiry pertains to the awarding of contract for Annual maintenance contract for pest control operations at UCSL facilities in Malpe, Baputhota & Hangarkatte facilities in Udupi district Karnataka.
- 1.2. The work is to be carried out at Udupi Cochin Shipyard Limited facility at Male, Baputhota & Hangarkatte Sites, in Udupi district, Karnataka.
- 1.3. The detailed Scope of work is Placed at Annexure-I

### **2. SCOPE OF WORK**

- 2.1. Contractor should provide effective, safe, and long-term protection against pest infestations through professional methods and government-approved chemicals.
- 2.2. The service should eliminate cockroaches, ants, flies, mosquitoes, spiders, rats, and mice etc.
- 2.3. Contractor should visit the site before submitting offer.
- 2.4. Service provider should use of government-approved, eco-friendly, and low-odour chemicals for pest control operation.
- 2.5. Service provider should provide Trained and uniformed technicians.
- 2.6. Use Scientific application methods ensuring safety of occupants and property.
- 2.7. Service provider should provide Complaint-based service: Within 24 hours of intimation at no extra cost.
- 2.8. If any additional treatments required service provider should provide free of cost during the contract period.

### **3. HEALTH, SAFETY & COMPLIANCE**

- 3.1. All services comply with the Insecticides Act, 1968
- 3.2. Chemicals used are approved by statutory authorities

**4. SCOPE OF UCSL**

- 4.1. Necessary instruction for pest control activity shall be provided by UCSL
- 4.2. Entry/Exit pass shall be arranged by UCSL

**5. SCHEDULE:**

- 5.1. Work must be completed as per the intimation received from UCSL.
- 5.2. Contractors shall complete the work as per instructions of UCSL executing officer.

**6. VALIDITY**

- 6.1. The AMC shall be valid for a period of One (1) Year from the date of commencement and it is extendable on mutual agreement.

**7. TAXES & DUTIES**


- 7.1. GST shall be applicable extra on the prescribed work from 01.07.2017 onwards. You are requested to furnish the following details in the invoice/Bill.
- Applicable rate of GST/SAC Code
  - Firms GST Reg. NO.
  - Service accounting code (SAC) as prescribed by statutory authorities.
  - GST Reg. No. of Udupi Cochin Shipyard Limited (**29AAACT1281B1ZO**).

**8. PAYMENT**

- 8.1. 100% Payment will be made for the actual quantity of work done.
- 8.2. Payment shall be made based on the total theoretical weight of the material fabricated.
- 8.3. Payment shall be released within 30 days from date of submission of bill and work completion certificate from the executing UCSL officer-in-charge.
- 8.4. Invoice shall be submitted with necessary Work completion certificate duly certified by UCSL executing officer.
- 8.5. Payment will be made by RTGS/NEFT to the account of Agency. The name of the bank, branch, A/C No., IFSC code & other particulars shall be furnished by the Agency in the proforma of UCSL.

**9. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES**

- 9.1. The progress of work will be monitored against the mutually agreed detailed schedule. Liquidated damages for delays in execution of the work beyond the commitment, for any reason other than force majeure conditions, will be recovered at the rate of half percent of the value of the contract per week or part thereof, subject to a maximum of ten (10) percent of the value of the contract.


- 9.2. For better clarity, order values mentioned in LD clause are values excluding duties and taxes (Basic value). Liquidated damages, if any, shall be decided and settled only after the completion of the entire project but prior to the release of Final stage Payment.
- 9.3. If, for any reasons, supplier has a justification towards delay in supply / work execution and would intend to consider applicability/ non applicability of LD, the same shall be intimated to UCSL by way of a letter, failing which it will be deemed that delay is attributable to the supplier.
- 9.4. Delay in supply/Interruption of the work for reasons not attributable to supplier shall entitle extension of the order execution period for proportionate period without any additional cost to UCSL.

## **10. TERMINATION & LIMITATION OF LIABILITY**

- 10.1. This contract may be terminated upon the occurrence of any of the following events
- 10.1.1. By agreement in writing of the parties hereto;
- 10.1.2. By the non-defaulting party, upon default by the other party, of any clause of this contract, if not remedied within thirty (30) days, or such longer time as may be agreed upon by the parties, after receipt of notice thereof in writing from the non-defaulting party;
- 10.1.3. By the other party, upon either party;
- (i) Making the assignment for the benefit of creditors, being adjudged a bankrupt or becoming insolvent; or
- (ii) Having a reasonable petition filed seeking its' dissolution or liquidation, not stayed or dismissed within sixty (60) days; or
- (iii) Ceasing to do business for any reason.
- 10.1.4. In cases where maximum limit of LD is reached and still the items are not delivered.
- 10.1.5. For fraud and corruption or other unacceptable practices.
- 10.1.6. Upon expiry or termination of this Contract, neither party shall be discharged from any antecedent obligations or liabilities to the other party under this Contract unless otherwise agreed in writing.
- 10.2. UCSL may give by notice in writing to supplier for terminate the order after issuing due notice i.e., 15 days' notice period. UCSL shall be entitled to compensation for the loss limited to the order value.
- 10.3. Liability maximum that can be claimed by the Agency shall be limited to what is due to be and has been paid by UCSL for work done as per the payment milestones and limited to work order value.

## **11. ARBITRATION & JURISDICTION**

- 11.1. Any disputes arising during the period of the contract shall, in the first instance be settled by mutual discussions and negotiations. The results of such resolution of dispute shall be incorporated as an amendment to the contract, failing which supplier shall approach the UCSL Grievance Redressal Committee as per relevant clause of the Contract.
- 11.2. If any dispute, disagreement, or question arising out of or relating to or in consequence of the contract, or to its fulfillment, or the validity of enforcement

thereof, cannot be settled mutually or the settlement of which is not herein specifically provided for, then the dispute shall within thirty days from the date either party informs the other in writing that such disputes, disagreement exists, be referred to arbitration. The arbitrators shall be appointed and the arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with and subject to the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 (No. 26 of 1996) as amended from time to time and the decision of the Arbitrators shall be final and binding on the parties hereto. The arbitration will be done by a Board comprising one arbitrator nominated by each party, and a mutually agreed Umpire. Each party shall bear its own cost of preparing and presenting its case. The cost of arbitration shall be shared equally by the parties unless the award provides otherwise. Performance under this Contract shall however, continue during arbitration proceedings and no payment due or payable by the parties hereto shall be withheld unless any such payment is or forms a part of the subject matter of arbitration proceedings.

- 11.3. Seat & Venue of Arbitration: The seat & venue of arbitration shall be at Bangalore.
- 11.4. Language of Arbitration: The Language of arbitration shall be English.
- 11.5. Governing Law: The contract shall be governed by Indian Law.
- 11.6. In case of disputes, the same will be subjected to the jurisdiction of courts at Bangalore, Karnataka.

## **12. SUB CONTRACTING AND ASSIGNMENT**

- 12.1. Contractor shall not assign nor transfer the Purchase Order/ Work Order nor shall any share or interest therein in any manner or degree be transferred or assigned by Contractor to a third party without prior consent in writing of UCSL.
- 12.2. Contractor shall not contract with any subcontractor and/or vendor without the prior written consent of UCSL. Such consent shall not relieve the Contractor from any of his responsibilities and liabilities under the Purchase Order/ Work Order. In addition, Contractor shall ensure that the terms and conditions of any such contract shall comply with and correspond to the terms and conditions of the Purchase Order/ Work Order.

## **13. SECRECY & RESTRICTION ON INFORMATION TO MEDIA**

- 13.1. The information contained in the enquiry as such shall NOT be communicated to any third party without prior approval of UCSL.
- 13.2. Information in respect of contracts/orders shall NOT be released to the national or international media or anyone not directly involved in its execution without the written approval of UCSL.

## **14. CANCELLATION OF ORDER AND RISK CONTRACTING**

- 14.1. In the event the contractor fails to complete the work promptly and satisfactorily as per the terms of the order, and if the work is delayed beyond thirty (30) days from the agreed schedule, UCSL, without prejudice, reserves the right to cancel the order and get the work done at contractor's cost and the expenditure so incurred including any damage or loss will be recovered from him and the Security Deposit furnished by him is liable to be forfeited either in whole or in part.

**15. FORCE MAJEURE**

- 15.1. Should failure in performance of any part of this contract arise from war, insurrection, restraint imposed by Government act or legislation of other statutory authority, from explosion, riot, legal lock-out, flood, fire, act of God or any inevitable or unforeseen event beyond human control which will be construed as a reasonable ground for extension of time, UCSL may allow such additional time as is mutually agreed to be justified by the circumstances of the case.

**16. SAFETY OF PERSONNEL AND FIRST AID**

- 16.1. The Agency shall be entirely responsible for the safety of all the personnel employed by him on the work. In this regard, he may adopt all the required safety measures and strictly comply with the safety regulations in force. In this regard, the Contractor will have to fully indemnify UCSL against any claims made by his workmen/other personnel.
- 16.2. The Agency may arrange to suitably insure all his workmen/ other personnel in this regard. UCSL will not be responsible for any injury or illness to the Contractor's workmen/other personnel during execution of the works due to whatsoever reasons.
- 16.3. The Agency shall provide and maintain so as to be readily accessible during all working hours, a first aid box with prescribed contents at every place where he employs contract labour for executing the works.

**17. LABOUR LAWS AND REGULATIONS**

- 17.1. The Contractor should employ **INDIAN NATIONALS** with valid citizenship only for works inside UCSL premises.
- 17.2. The Contractor shall undertake and execute the work with contract Labor only after taking license from the appropriate authority under the Contract Labor (Regulation & Abolition) Act 1970.
- 17.3. The Contractor shall observe and comply with the provisions of all labour and industrial laws and enactments and shall comply with and implement the provisions of the Factories Act, 1948, Employees Provident Funds & Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952, Employees State Insurance Act, Payment of Gratuity Act, minimum Wages Act, Payment of Bonus Act, Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act and all other enactments as are applicable to him and his workmen employed by him. The Contractor shall inform UCSL his license number from the Central Labour Commissioner.
- 17.4. All contract workmen, except those exempted under the respective Acts, shall necessarily be insured under the ESI scheme and be made members of the EPF Scheme from the day of their engagement as contract workmen in the Company. In Case 1, All such insured contract workmen should carry with them their ESI Identity Card for verification by the authorities. No contract workmen without a valid ESI Identity Card for verification by the authorities will be permitted to work in the company.
- 17.5. The Contractor shall submit the Labour Reports>Returns as required by the Company from time to time in respect of their workmen in standard format to the concerned contracting

- 17.6. If the Contractor fails to pay any contributions, charges or other amounts payable under any of the aforementioned provisions of law, UCSL shall deduct or adjust amounts equivalent to such contribution, charges or amounts from amount payable to him by UCSL, including any deposit or amounts payable against bills and make payments on his account to the appropriate authority. He shall not be entitled to question or challenge such deductions, adjustments or payment made by UCSL.
- 17.7. Any other amount payable under any law or in respect of any person employed by the Contractor, if not paid by him, shall be deducted or adjusted by UCSL out of any amount payable to the Contractor including any Security Receipt and paid ever or withheld for payment by UCSL.
- 17.8. The Contractor shall be fully responsible for the conduct and discipline of the workmen employed by him in the Company premises. If such workmen commit any misconduct or criminal act inside the Company, the Contractor shall take appropriate action against such workmen. The contractor shall abide by the instructions/ guidelines issued by the Company for maintenance of discipline and good conduct among the workmen employed by him.
- 17.9. All persons who are engaged for various works in UCSL either directly or through contractors, should produce the following documents prior to issuing their entry passes:
- 17.10. Passport/attested copy of passport with photo and address particulars.  
 OR
- 17.11. Police clearance certificate with photo and address particulars. (Police clearance certificate to the effect that the concerned person is staying in the area of jurisdiction of the certificate issuing Police Station and that the person is not involved in any criminal offences as per the records available therein.)
- 17.12. **Contractors are to familiarize themselves with the labour rules & regulations.**

**18. OTHER TERMS & CONDITIONS**

- 18.1. UCSL reserves the right to accept / reject any offer.
- 18.2. Damages caused to the Shipyard properties/tools/accessories should be rectified by the Contractor at his cost or proportional recoveries will be made from the contractor while passing their bills for payment.
- 18.3. The Contractor shall indemnify UCSL or its officers against any claims arising out of accidents or injuries to workmen or other persons or damage to other property which may arise during the execution of the contract or from breach of any Law or Regulation prior to delivery and acceptance of the items at UCSL.
- 18.4. It is also to be understood by the Contractor that Udupi Cochin Shipyard Limited does not bind itself to give the Contractor any regular or specific quantity or area of work and it shall be done at the sole discretion of UCSL depending on the prevailing site conditions and other limiting factors and no claim on this account from the contractor shall be entertained.
- 18.5. Addenda to this Tender document, if issued, must be signed and submitted along with the Tender document.
- 18.6. The Contractor shall also be governed by the General Conditions of Contract of UCSL, General Safety Rules and other relevant Labour laws.

**PROVIDING PEST CONTROL SERVICES  
FOR ANTI-LARVAL, ADULT MOSQUITO AND RODENET, LIZARDS  
INSIDE MALPE, BPAUTHOTA, HANGARKATTE YARDS**

**Detailed scope of work**

**1. Anti-larval control measures**

Anti-larval control measures operation with safe and effective chemicals (along with allied management like source reduction and canalization) with hand sprayer in all the areas of Malpe, Hangarakatte, Baputhota premises of Udupi CSL. by Anti Larval measures **twice in a week** for a **period of One Year** to the satisfaction of UCSL Officers as given in the conditions. Includes supply of TEMEPHOS 50% EC required for Anti Larval and Anti adult mosquito control works. The rate includes cost and conveyance of all the materials. 180 ml of TEMEPHOS 50% E.C. larvicide is to be mixed with 60 litres of water for one operation. The mixture to be sprayed in mosquitoes breeding places, larva breeding containers/materials at the identified places and water stagnant places. The rate includes all the Labour charges, cost of all equipment's like Hand Compressions sprayers, safety materials required etc., and cost of other consumables required for the work.

**2. Adult mosquito control measures by Fogging**

Adult mosquito control measures by fogging with safe and effective chemicals with thermal fogger in all the areas of Malpe, Hangarakatte, Baputhota premises of Udupi CSL. All areas to be covered for indoor fogging **once in a week** for a **period of 12 months** to the satisfaction of UCSL Officers as given in the conditions. Includes supply of Pyrethrum 2% extract conforming to IS 1501 chemicals/insecticides required for Anti Larval and anti-adult mosquito control works. The rate includes cost and conveyance of all the materials. 250 ml of pyrethrum 2% extract is mixed with 4.750 litres diesel for the indoor fogging. The rate includes all the Labour charges, cost of all equipment's like Thermo Fogging machine, safety materials required etc., and cost of other consumables such as petrol, diesel, required for the work.

**3. Rodents & Lizards control**

Rats are very fast and agile animals and therefore, careful manipulation and constant vigilance is necessary to keep a place free of rats. Rats are found in kitchen area, store area, office area & outer side area. Rat cause damage packaging materials, gnaw wood, pipes, electrical cable, books, carpets. The operator shall maintain a constant watch on the any signs of rodent infestation. Contractor shall check all premises as per requirements

throughout the year to replenish the baits and to be rearranged the traps strategically so as to achieve the best possible result and eliminate the rodent infestation.

- 3.1. Rodent control shall be carried out by baiting and trapping or any other suitable method in the specified areas. Bromadiolone baits or equivalent should be used to control the Rodents.
- 3.2. The contractor shall make arrangements to identify the rat entry points in our premises enabling to take necessary remedial action. Movement of Rats inside the premises shall be prevented by using glue boards, ultrasonic machine, cage etc. Dead bodies of the Rats to be removed immediately and taken out of company Premises. Poisoning anywhere due to dead rats to be avoided.
- 3.3. Inspection of all specified areas falling under Rodent control shall be carried out at a frequency not less than **once in two days for 12 months** and baits shall be replaced/refilled on requirement.
- 3.4. The control services shall consist of baiting with anti-coagulant baits and trapping. The baits and traps shall be laid at selected points on the runway of rats and mice. The operator shall maintain a constant watch on the progress.
- 3.5. For rodent control, a special bait station and traps shall be kept according to movements of Rats.
- 3.6. Roda Box: A systematic trapping measure shall be taken using rodabox which will be kept at strategic point where there is rodent path way.
- 3.7. Disinfestation services to cockroach control shall be done once in three months in all the specified areas.
- 3.8. Disinfestation for snake control shall be done as and when required in all the specified areas.
- 3.9. The general pest control shall include eradication of cockroaches, mosquitoes, flies, lizards, termites, silver fish (insect), white ants etc., through permitted insecticides as per Government of India and WHO norms. The pest control should cover all the places like spraying under the tables, chairs, almirahs, around the piles of files, on furniture, false ceiling, all stair cases, toilets, drain ducts etc., no spaces should be left unattended and the **pest control activity should be done on a Monthly basis during the initial control period 12 months.**
- 3.10. Cages shall also use inside the premises.
- 3.11. Disinfestations services for control of Lizard shall be done applying a coat of suitable chemicals on the edges of wall towards the roof once in a month in all the specified areas.

### **Conditions**

1. The contractor has to visit the place of work on his own to access the scope and nature of work before quoting his rates.
2. The scope of work under various items of work includes all Labour charges, tools, machines, safety measures etc.
3. Daily Labour report in duplicate has to be submitted to Udupi CSL.
4. The contractor has to issue safety shoes, safety aprons and helmets to the workmen engaged by him. Also, the contractor has to issue other safety appliances like nose mask, rubber gloves, goggles, and face masks etc., required for the workmen at the frequency as per the requirement at site.
5. Only the chemicals mentioned in the schedule of items shall be supplied for the supply of chemicals, Materials & tools. In case, if the chemicals of item mentioned in the Schedule is not available in the market, proof should be furnished for the non-availability of those particular chemicals from the Manufacturer / Dealer. Only in such case, equivalent material will be accepted after considering the cost and quality.
6. Sample shall be supplied for the items not mentioned with the brand and only after obtaining approval of sample the contractor shall affect the bulk supply.
7. Mosquito Control Works:
  - 7.1. Anti - Larval Treatment: Anti - Larval Treatment has to be carried out in all drains, stagnated water and all other breeding places by using Hand Compression Sprayers. The contractor should have at least two numbers of Hand Compression sprayers in good working condition at each site of work for carrying out this work. The areas of Maple, Baputhota, Hangarakatte yard premises should be covered twice in a week.

Anti adult Mosquito measures such as fogging control works with spraying shall be carried out in a weekly once at all locations for 6 months during monsoon season as directed by UCSL, so that the entire yard area is maintained mosquito free at all time. The contractor shall use portable Fogging Machine for this work.

The following chemicals of relevant BIS Specifications shall be mixed in appropriate concentration to suit the site condition and as directed by UCSL.


The contractor has to supply the consumable like Petrol, Diesel required for the fogging machine and Hand Compression sprayer at his own cost.

- The contractor has to bring Thermo fogging Machine and Hand Compression sprayers at his own cost.
- Tools & tackles, lifting machines & Safety appliances that are used for the work or by the workmen should possess IS I mark and valid test certificate from the competent authority.
- The contractor should observe all safety rules and regulations in force and ensure that all necessary safety precautions are followed up strictly for the safety of workers engaged in the work.
- The contractor should engage adequate man power having appropriate skills with the approval of the UCSL officials to carry out and complete the works. Any extra time /over time engagement of the man power shall be the contractor's responsibility.

#### **OPERATING PROCEDURES**

a) Anti Larval Operation: 30 ML of TEMEPHOS 50% E.C. chemical is to be mixed with 10 litres of water and which is poured into hand operated/ knapsack sprayer tank. The procedure is repeated SIX times. Overall, 180 ml of TEMEPHOS 50% E.C. larvicides is mixed with 60 litres of water for one operation.

b) FOGGING: 250 ml of pyrethrum 2% extract is to be mixed with 4.750

litres diesel for indoor area mosquitoes' adulticides. The mixture solution 5 litres is poured in 5 litre capacity fogger machines and machines consumed one litre petrol for per operation.

8. Manpower deployment will be planned adequately. Only experienced qualified well-trained technicians should undertake operation under the guidance of their M.Sc. (Agri.) or equivalent qualifications qualified supervisor. Bidder should submit the certificate and name of such technician along with the tender including name of both technicians
9. Trained operator to be deployed on daily basis except on Udupi CSL holidays.
10. Contractor is required to use environment friendly chemicals duly approved by Govt. /Authorized agencies.
11. Chemicals/ repellents used shall not have any side effects on human beings. Work should be taken up as per the direction and satisfaction of Udupi Cochin Shipyard officials.
12. The contractor is responsible for keeping surrounding areas clean during treatment.
13. The names of the chemicals mentioned in the tender document are only indicative, however, the contractor will be responsible for using only WHO approved chemicals with proper information to Udupi CSL.
14. The contractor should submit detailed technical specification of the chemical and the treatments to be adopted, along with the Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) for each chemical used before execution.
